

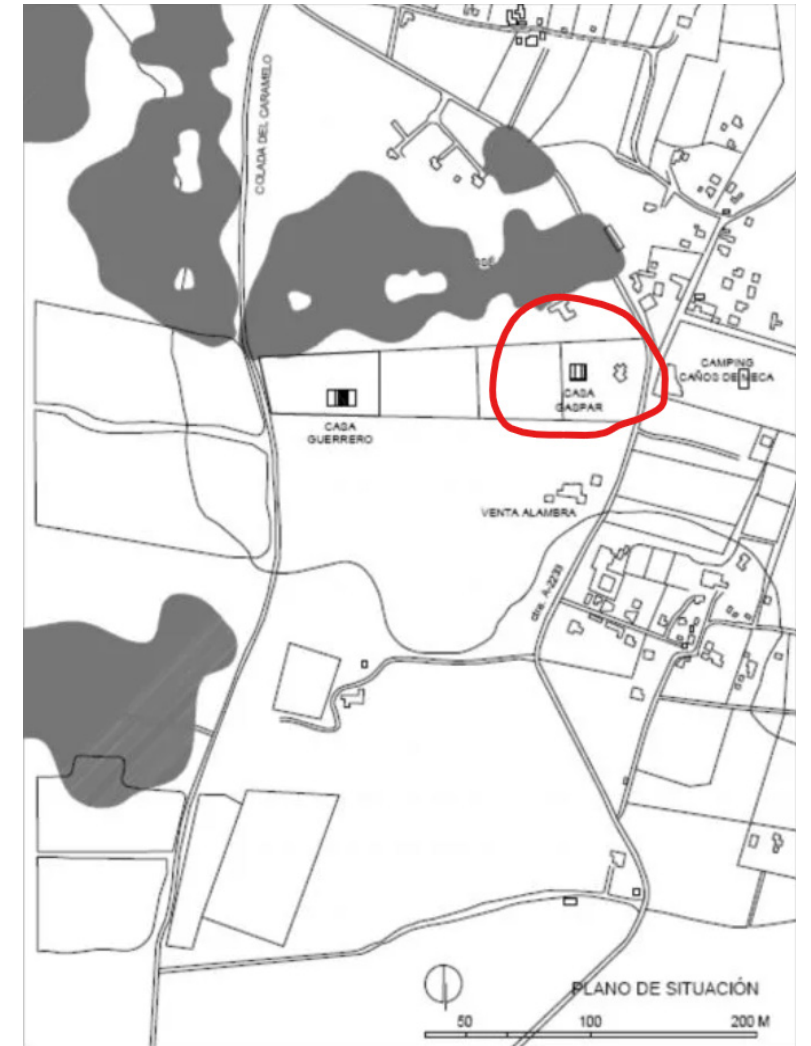
Casa Gaspar-Inspired Ring

Casa Gaspar - Vejer de la Frontera area, Cádiz, Spain

The house is a perfect square, 18m x 18m, divided into three equal bands; only the central band is roofed. The client wanted "absolute independence", so Alberto created a 'hortus conclusus' - a walled garden. From the exterior, the house is a simple white walled box. Internally, the house is well lit by the glazed walls as they meet the sun. Four square openings sized at 2 x 2 meters are positioned where the interior walls find the perimeter walls - extending the perception of the floor plane outward.

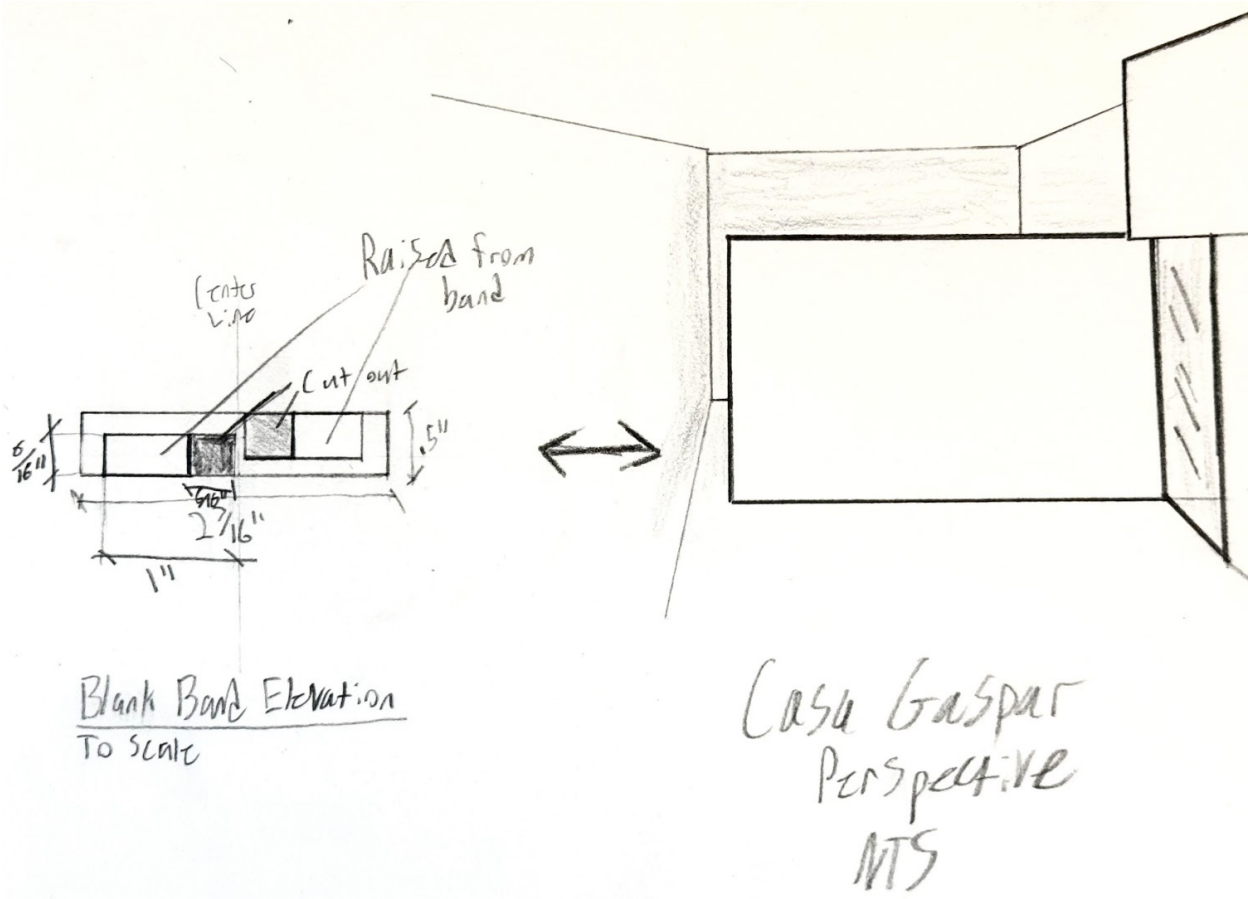

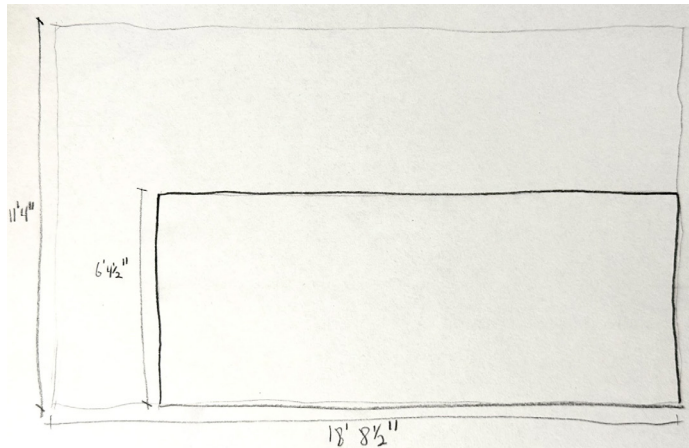

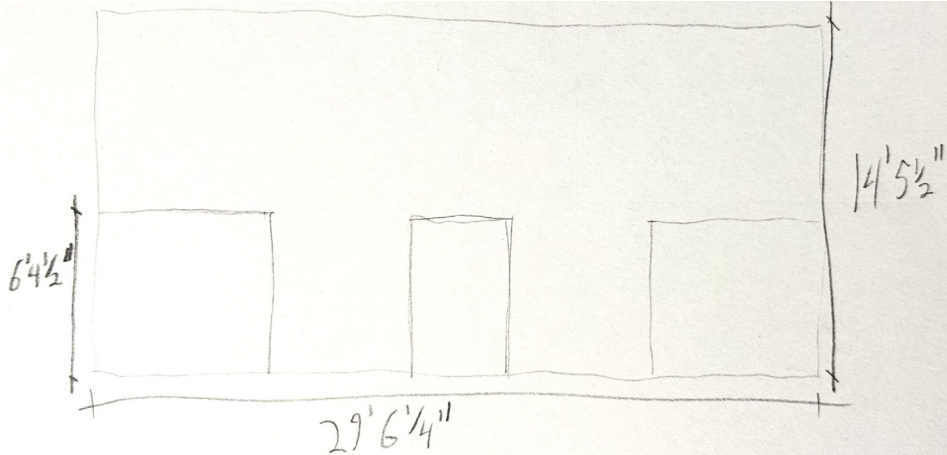

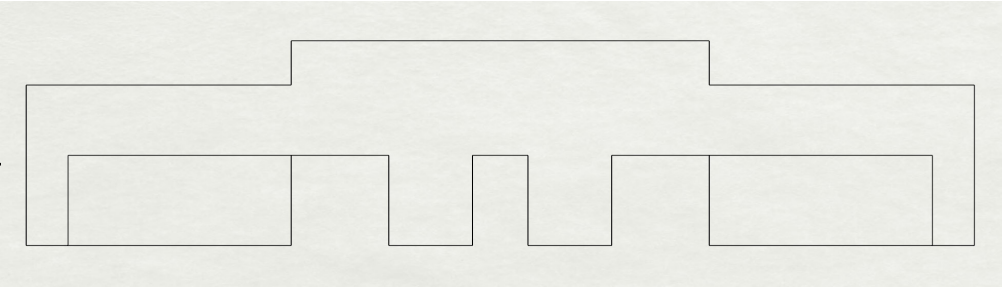
Concept Sketch



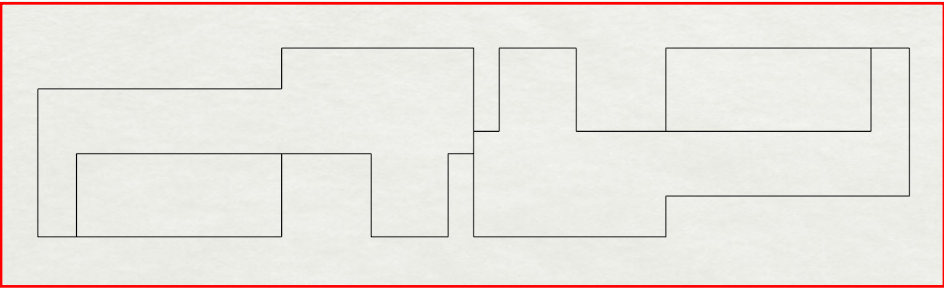
Elevation Parti



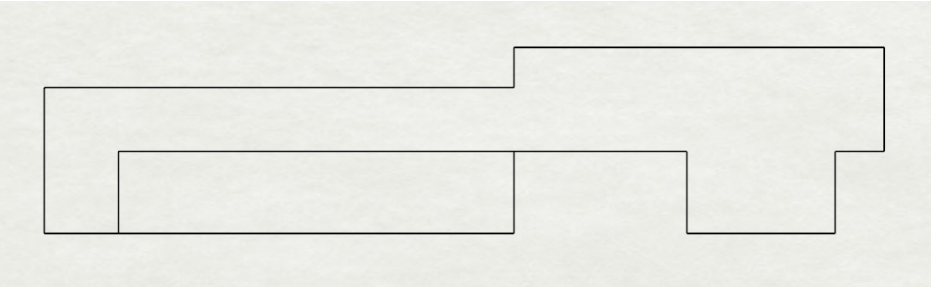
Original Elevation Study



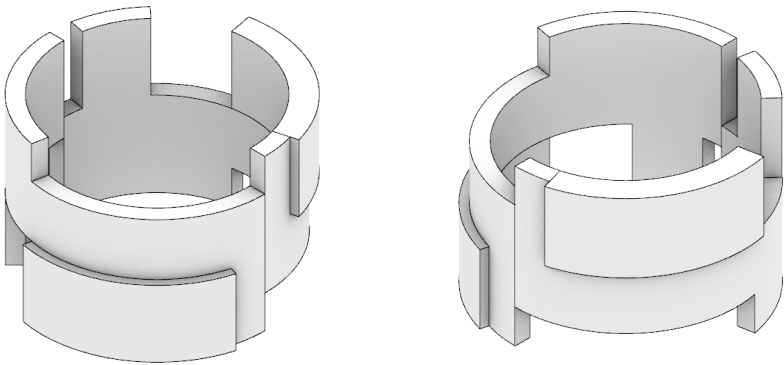
Second Elevation Study (Final Version)

Elevation / Blank Band Iterations

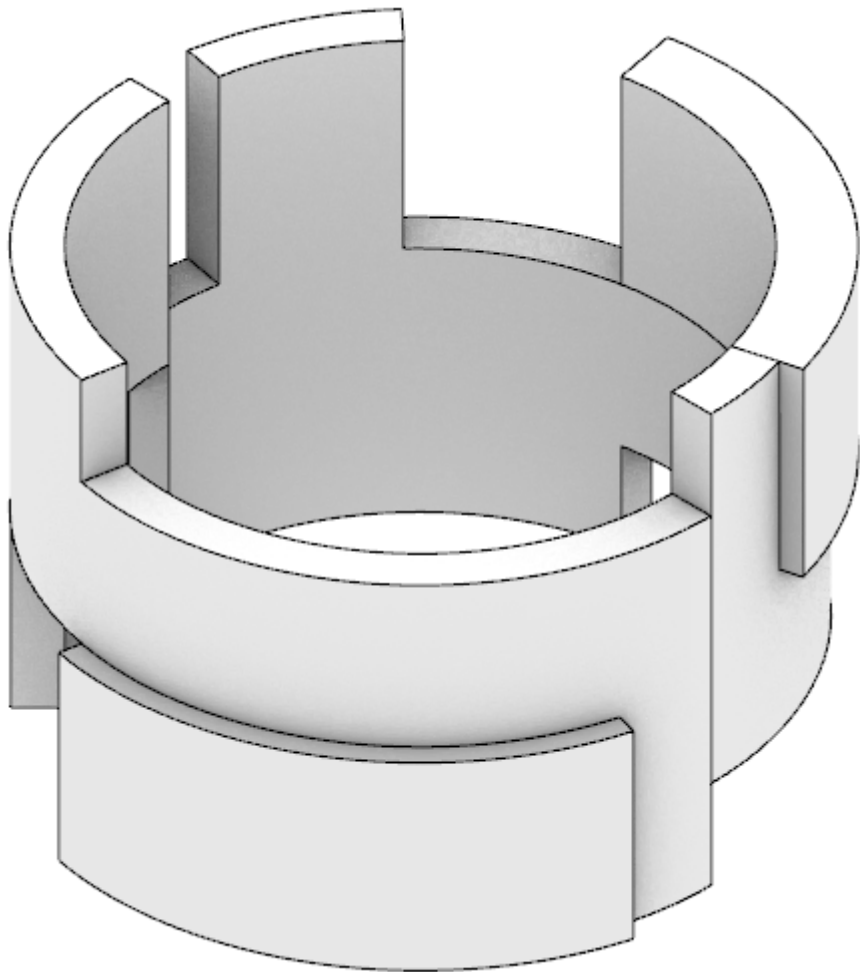


Isometric 3D Model Views

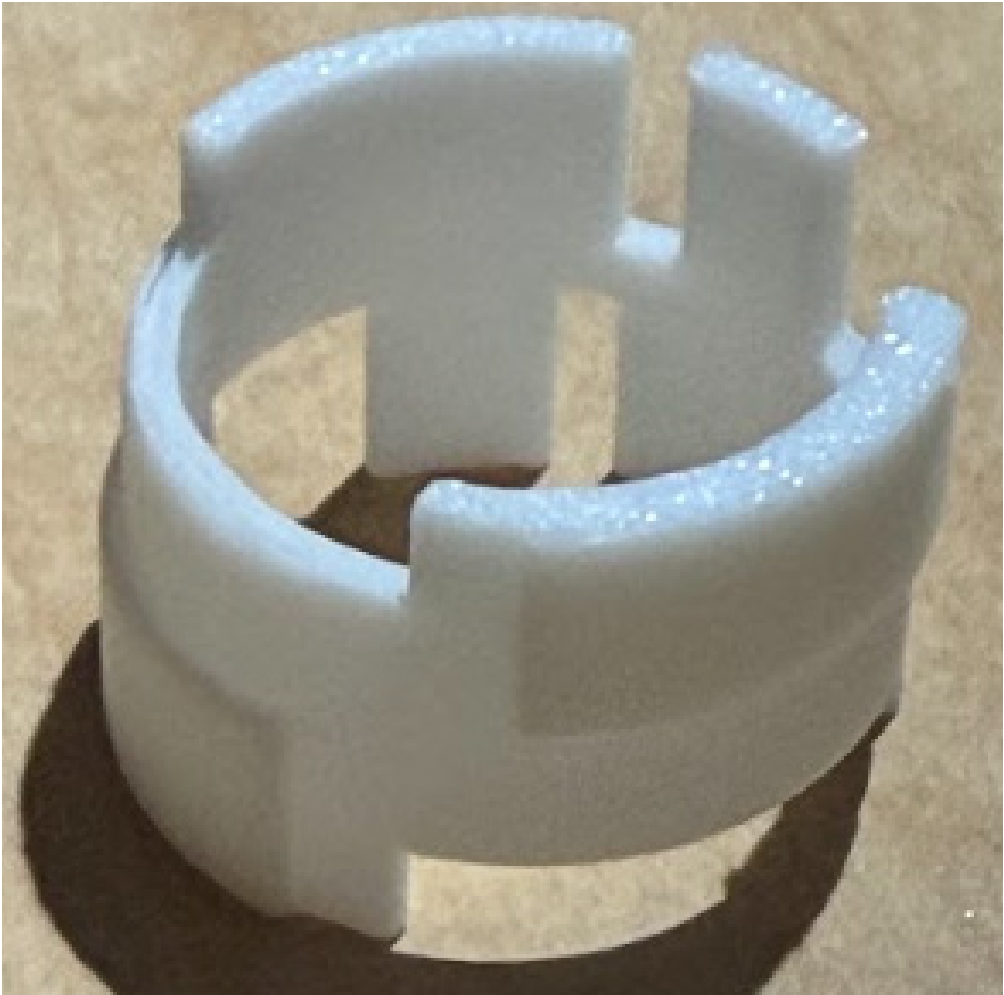
